Court-Approved Legal Notice

If you had an **automobile insurance** policy with **Liberty Mutual/Safeco** with UM/UIM coverage and/or were insured and filed a claim for UIM benefits between **October 1, 2010** and **March 31, 2022**, you may be entitled to a cash payment from a class action settlement.

Lawsuit Background

You may be eligible for a cash payment from a \$6.5 million class action settlement against Defendants Liberty Mutual Insurance Company, Liberty Personal Insurance Company, First National Insurance Company of America, LM General Insurance Company, LM Property and Casualty Insurance Company, LM Insurance Company, Safeco Insurance Company of America, and Safeco National Insurance Company.

The class action involves allegations that Defendants failed to properly advise New Mexico insureds that any amounts payable on an underinsured motorist claim are required by law to be reduced, or "offset," by amounts the insured received from the insurer of the driver who was at fault for the auto accident. Defendants deny the allegations but have agreed to settle the lawsuit.

Who is included in the Settlement Class?

The Class includes those who 1) had an underinsured motorist claim reduced or "offset" by the amount paid by the at-fault driver in an accident between October 1, 2010 and March 31, 2022, and/or 2) purchased a New Mexico automobile insurance policy containing UM/UIM motorist coverage between October 1, 2010 through March 31, 2022.

What does the Settlement Provide?

Records show you are a Settlement Class Member.

Offset Subclass Cash Payment

If you were in an accident between October 1, 2010 and March 31, 2022, and submitted an underinsured motorist coverage insurance claim that was reduced, or "offset," by the amount you received from the insurer of the at-fault driver, you may be eligible to receive up to **\$25,000**.

You need to submit a Claim online or by mail postmarked by **April 30, 2026**.

OR

Direct Premium Refund Payment. If you do not submit a Claim Form related to an accident, but you purchased a New Mexico automobile insurance policy with UM/UIM coverage, you will automatically receive a *pro rata* (a legal term meaning equal share) payment.

Your Offset Subclass Cash Payment may be subject to a *pro rata* (a legal term meaning equal share) decrease based on the total of all valid Claims. Settlement Class Members who receive an Offset Subclass Payment will not be entitled to a Direct Premium Refund Payment.

Other Options

Opt-Out postmarked by April 15, 2026. Submit an opt-out if you do not want to be legally bound by the Settlement. The Court will exclude class members who request to opt-out.

Object by April 15, 2026. You may object to the Settlement if you do not opt-out. The Long Form Notice on the Settlement Website explains how to opt-out or object.

Final Approval Hearing on June 2, 2026. The Court will decide whether to approve the Settlement, Class Counsel's attorneys' fees and gross receipt tax of up to \$2,332,138.28 and costs not to exceed \$6,000.00, a \$10,000 services award, and any objections.

You or your lawyer may ask to appear at the hearing, but it is not required.
